Introduction

The main objective of this Cultural Mobility Funding Guide is to provide an overview of the funding bodies and programmes that support the international mobility of artists and culture professionals travelling from/to 8 South Mediterranean countries and territories, namely Algeria, Egypt, Libya, Malta, Morocco, Tunisia, the South Italian islands (Sicily, Pantelleria, Egadi Islands, Pelagie Islands), and the Spanish territories of Ceuta and Melilla.

On the Move commissioned researchers based in Algeria, Morocco, Egypt and Spain to map grants and support schemes focusing on the South Mediterranean region in order to help organisations and arts workers to engage with international colleagues and finance their international travel. This research took place from September 2022 to January 2023.

This Cultural Mobility Funding Guide should also provide inspiration for those responsible for public policies and mobility funds at local, regional, national and European level, as well as private donors and mobility stakeholders at large. Reinforcing awareness of the remaining obstacles that stand in the way of equal access to international opportunities, it can suggest areas that should be financed more fairly and efficiently in order to ensure more sustainable support for cross-border cultural collaboration.

How to navigate this guide?

This guide lists local, national and international resources, both public and private. Only regular opportunities accessible online are listed. Funds which only provide information offline, which do not invite applications through open calls, or which are ad hoc or temporary are not included.

There are various reasons a user of this guide might seek mobility funding, including:

- They have been selected for a project in a foreign country (collaboration project, artistic residency, participation in a festival, etc.) but have not been provided with funding for their mobility costs.
- They have developed a project with an international component and wish to invite foreign artists and cultural professionals to one or more places/countries for co-production, touring, market development, etc.
- They are interested in working experiences (including training) in a foreign country and are seeking a way to cover their travel costs.

In light of these different aims, the entries in this guide present the costs that are covered by each scheme, including cross-border travel, visas, per diems, remuneration of collaborators, accommodation, production costs, and other types of support (e.g. translation).

Like On the Move's other Cultural Mobility Funding Guides, this publication includes:

- Opportunities provided by a diverse range of funders: international organisations, regional bodies, national institutions, local authorities, private foundations, etc.
- Schemes supporting a variety of mobility formats, including peer meetings, workshops, residencies, travel grants, training programmes, and networking opportunities, with the aim of supporting everything from collaboration to cultural production, professional development, and the evolution of sector-wide practices.
- Only opportunities for which cross-border travel costs are at least partially funded. We
 also list local, regional and international programmes that include transnational mobility
 as a component of their support to artists and cultural organisations in the region.
- Opportunities from all arts disciplines: performing arts (theatre, dance, opera, circus, street arts); visual arts (painting, sculpture, photography, installation, applied arts); new media arts and web-based arts; music; literature (writing, translation); heritage (tangible heritage, movable heritage, intangible heritage, archives); interdisciplinary arts; research; cultural management.

This guide collects:

- Mobility funding opportunities open to nationals and residents in one of the South Mediterranean contexts in focus, described as Outgoing Mobility (<).
- Mobility funding opportunities open to nationals from countries other than these South Mediterranean contexts, described as Incoming Mobility (⇒).

This Cultural Mobility Funding Guide also tries to highlight those schemes that respond to growing, transversal sectoral and societal concerns – particularly programmes that make extra funding available for overland travel (where possible), for the needs of disabled artists or caregivers, or for digital or hybrid formats of cross-border collaboration.

Our mapping process and its limits

This guide is an attempt to gather all relevant resources together in one document. It draws on extensive online research as well as on previously completed studies. However, this guide is by no means complete, and the information provided does not grant any rights to applicants when applying to any of the organisations or funders mentioned in this guide.

Obtaining funding is often a considerable challenge. This Cultural Mobility Funding Guide draws on the third edition of the Cultural Mobility Funding Guide focused on the Arab region and guides focused on Italy and Spain, while further expanding it¹. However, the joint research for this publication has taken place at a time when many funders are resuming their activity after the Covid-19 crisis – a period which forced many of them to adapt, move online, or cancel their mobility funding schemes. Some funders are currently reviewing their strategies and the information in this document is therefore likely to evolve according to new policy priorities.

The researchers of this guide also faced a number of specific challenges, noted where relevant during the document. For example, at times there was a lack of information online in relation to costs covered, criteria applied, or clear timelines for programmes, as well as an absence of application forms. Another recurring issue is the diverse terminology used in the region and internationally, which leaves the door open to different interpretations of eligibility criteria and geographical scopes. For example, with denominations such as 'Arab region', 'Arab world', or 'Arab countries', practitioners might question if all cultural and ethnic components of the macro-region are eligible without distinction. Moreover, funders sometimes refer to acronyms such as MENA (Middle East and North Africa) or SWANA (South West Asian North African) without providing clear lists of eligible countries, when we know their geographical scope is not unanimously agreed by international institutions.

Though this guide attempts to be as extensive and accurate as possible, the individual entries may be outdated, inaccurate or incomplete. Please refer to the websites of the listed funds for the latest updates. Introduction

This section presents information on existing international mobility opportunities for artists and culture professionals who are from the Southern Mediterranean or aim to work there. Complementing the country or region-based sections which make up this guide, the focus here is on those mobility schemes that could be of interest to artists, culture professionals, and culture organisations in all or most of the countries covered. Readers with a particular interest in one country or region are encouraged to look through both this section and the one dedicated to their place of interest.

Entries in this section are ordered on the basis of the organisations that have established the relevant programmes. The first subsection includes funds established and managed by public organisations, including national governments and their related agencies, as well as intergovernmental organisations and regional integration organisations (in particular the European Commission). The second subsection collects opportunities launched by foundations, including some which are connected to public authorities. A third subsection gathers information related to opportunities managed by NGOs and independent cultural organisations. Finally, some additional information resources which provide regular information on international mobility opportunities are included in the last subsection.

The evidence collected shows that there is a substantial number of schemes which have either a regional or a broader geographic focus (e.g. programmes which are open to artists from all countries or those coming from 'developing' or 'transition' countries). This trend is even clearer when compared to the relatively limited number of funds which have been found in some of the individual countries and regions covered in this guide. While this broadens opportunities for stakeholders in these regions, it also brings increased competition.

Most of the schemes presented in this section have been established either by public agencies from countries in the 'Global North' (primarily by arts councils, development agencies, and national cultural institutes based in Europe, some of which have offices in the Southern Mediterranean) or by private foundations and residencies. The predominant types of mobility which are supported tend to be capacity building, mobility connected to project or production grants, and support for participation in artist residencies.

Among the disciplines or artforms which appear more frequently are performing arts and visual arts, as well as film, with smaller numbers dedicated to music, literature and research, or open to all areas. There appear to be more programmes enabling the outgoing mobility of artists and culture professionals from the Southern Mediterranean (particularly those in North Africa) than incoming mobility to the region, although this may partly be due to the particular lens adopted during the research. Meanwhile, only a handful of schemes available in the region appear to have integrated some of the emerging themes in mobility (such as being open to digital or hybrid mobility, being particularly aware of diversity and accessibility, or providing additional support for green mobility). This remains however a moving landscape, and it is likely, and to be hoped, that new opportunities of this kind will be established in the near future.

It is important to note that while other institutions and private arts residencies may contribute to international exchanges in the arts and cultural sector, they do not always respond to the criteria

established for this guide (e.g. providing funding to cover cross-border mobility), which means that they have not been included here.

Furthermore, the research relies on information available online. Other opportunities may exist but could either not be accessible online or have not been identified during this research exercise. Indeed, given the broad remit and the always changing reality of this sector, it is certain that some schemes have been overlooked, something for which the authors apologise. Partly to address this, the guide includes, in its final subsection, other information resources which are regularly updated and which could complement the references collected here.

Creative Europe is the European Commission's 'flagship' programme to support the culture and audiovisual sectors. It places particular emphasis on strengthening these sectors and their cross-national dimension, including in terms of mobility. Eligibility is restricted primarily to EU countries (including Italy, Malta, and Spain, as well as the other 22 EU member states), other countries of the European Economic Area (Iceland, Norway, and Liechtenstein), EU acceding, candidate and potential candidate countries (Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia, Turkey, and Ukraine), and some countries benefitting from the European Neighbourhood Policy (including Armenia, Georgia, Israel, Palestine, and Tunisia).

Introduction

The information in this section was collected through extensive online research and interviews with a number of cultural workers in Algeria's independent cultural scene, as well as through conversations with professionals working in international cooperation with experience in the country. It draws on previous Mobility Funding Guides for the Arab region (2020) and the African continent (2019) published by On the Move. The institutions/funders listed in those guides were contacted in order to update the information for applicants.

In Algeria, there is an active independent cultural scene, but the majority of financial support for cultural organisations, artists, and culture professionals comes through international funding bodies and civil society organisations. There is little support from national funders for incoming and outgoing mobility in Algeria.

The international funding that the Algerian creative sector benefits from is essentially project-based. The project model offers many advantages, but also has its limitations. Outcomes can be short-lived, and artists and cultural professionals have less freedom to define their own aims.

The Covid-19 pandemic and the political unrest of recent years has also meant that some national and local organisations have struggled to maintain their activities. Nevertheless, artists and culture professionals in Algeria are used to improvising. However unprecedented the current crisis may be, individuals and organisations alike face today's challenges with great resourcefulness and adaptability.

On this note, when planning mobility to Algeria it's often a good idea to identify and contact individuals from the country's artistic scene, as organisations and funding schemes can change from one year to the next.

Readers should also remember to consult the chapter on International Mobility Funding for the South Mediterranean Region, as this will contain additional programmes covering Algeria.

Public organisations active at national level

* Centre of research in social and cultural anthropology (CRASC)

Created in 1992, RASC is a national research institution that provides funding to Algerian researchers residing in Algeria or abroad. The missions of the CRASC are to develop basic and applied research in Social and Cultural Anthropology in conjunction with national development priorities, as well as to organise and promote meetings between researchers in order to foster scientific information. Additionally, the CRASC publishes a periodic scientific review in order to disseminate research results and maintain regular communication among researchers.

Today, the Centre has four research units: the Research Unit of Culture, Communication, Languages, Literature and Arts (UCCLLA), and the Research Unit on Translation and Terminology (URTT), both based in Oran; the Research Unit on name systems in Algeria (RASYD), based in Algiers; and the Research Unit on Emerging Territories and Societies (ETS), based in Constantine.

Introduction

The information in this section was collected through extensive online research and interviews with a number of cultural workers in Egypt's independent cultural scene, as well as through conversations with professionals working in international cooperation with experience in the country. It draws on previous Mobility Funding Guides for the Arab region (2020) and the African continent (2019) published by On the Move. The institutions/funders listed in those guides were contacted in order to update the information for applicants.

While researching this guide, we found that there has been an increase in support for Egyptian artists from national private foundations (such as Sawiris Foundation for Social Development in Cairo). Organisations and foundations in other countries – such as Warehouse 421 and Alserkal Foundation in UAE – have also opened their funding to countries in the wider region. With the increase in support from these regional and international foundations, we believe that Egypt now has more international and regional mobility opportunities than ever.

One challenge in the research mapping was that information wasn't always accessible online. For instance, there are a number of grants and scholarship opportunities organised by the Ministry of Culture in Egypt that are announced in the press, but for which information is not available online, or not updated, and where the submission process is offline.

When researching mobility relating to Egypt, readers should also remember to consult the chapter on International Mobility Funding for the South Mediterranean Region, as this will contain additional programmes covering the country.

Introduction

This section presents information on existing international mobility opportunities for artists and culture professionals who are from Sicily, Pantelleria, Egadi Islands (Favignana, Levanzo, Marettimo, Formica, and Maraone) and Pelagie Islands (Lampedusa, Lampione, and Linosa), or who aim to work in these regions of Italy. It is important to note that, given the specific focus of this guide on the Southern Mediterranean, other opportunities which have a broader geographical scope (e.g. mobility funding opportunities available at national level across Italy) have not been included. Similarly, because the focus lies on international, cross-border opportunities, schemes meant to enable collaboration between these islands and other regions in Italy have not been included either.

The evidence obtained shows that existing opportunities concentrate primarily in Sicily and, more particularly, in Palermo, the most populated city in the area analysed. The presence of some foreign cultural institutes, as well as non-profit foundations, provides the main setting for these mobility opportunities. This remains, however, a relatively limited range of schemes. In addition to the selection criteria outlined above, another factor in the limited number of opportunities may be the relatively small scale of the territories covered, particularly when Sicily is left aside. Furthermore, the research relies on information available online. Other opportunities may exist but could either not be accessible online or have not been identified during this research exercise.

In addition to the listed programmes, the guide includes other information resources which are regularly updated and which could complement the references collected here. Readers should also remember to consult the chapter on International Mobility Funding for the South Mediterranean Region, as this will contain additional programmes covering the relevant regions of Italy.

Introduction

The information in this section was collected through extensive online research and interviews with a number of cultural workers in Libya's independent cultural scene, as well as through conversations with professionals working in international cooperation with experience in the country. It draws on previous Mobility Funding Guides for the Arab region (2020) and the African continent (2019) published by On the Move. The institutions/funders listed in those guides were contacted in order to update the information for applicants.

Research for this section shows that the number of funding opportunities in Libya is very limited. There are few sources of mobility funding, and those which do exist come from international and regional foundations rather than national ones – a situation that reflects the complex civil wars Libya has faced in recent years.

Alongside support from international cultural organisations, there is some funding from the civil society sector through international organisations such as ACTED, or foreign institutes such as British Council Libya. These support local civil society organisations to develop projects and programmes through the arts.

In conversations with Libyan cultural actors, we found that national public organisations such as the Culture Ministry in Libya used to grant travel funding for individuals – but this was before 2011, and the programmes did not operate on an open call basis. This funding is no longer available.

We also note that some foreign embassies or foreign institutes are no longer present in Libya. For instance, US Embassy Libya is now operating through the US Embassy in Tunis, though it still has mobility funding programmes that cover Libya – such as the Iowa International Writing programme.

When researching mobility relating to Libya, readers should also remember to consult the chapter on International Mobility Funding for the South Mediterranean Region, as this will contain additional programmes covering the country.

Introduction

This section presents information on existing international mobility opportunities for artists and culture professionals who are from Malta or aiming to work there.

The evidence obtained shows that Arts Council Malta, the national agency for development and investment in Malta's cultural and creative sectors, is also the main organisation providing support for international exchanges. In addition to this, one other scheme, managed by the Ministry for Education, Sport, Youth, Research and Innovation, has been identified. Only one of the schemes identified addresses one of the three emerging or 'specific' areas which were investigated in this guide (namely, the consideration of digital or hybrid mobility, the other two being specific consideration of diversity and accessibility, and 'green' support funding). While this is not dissimilar to trends observed elsewhere, this could be a topic to further explore in the near future by all agents involved.

It is important to note that, while other national institutions and private arts residencies may contribute to international exchanges in the arts and cultural sector, they do not always respond to the criteria established for this guide (e.g. providing funding to cover cross-border mobility), which means that they have not been included here. Furthermore, the research relies on information available online. Other opportunities may exist but could either not be accessible online or have not been identified during this research exercise.

In addition to this, the guide includes other information resources which are regularly updated and which could complement the references collected here. Readers should also remember to consult the chapter on International Mobility Funding for the South Mediterranean Region, as this will contain additional programmes covering Malta.

Introduction

The information in this section was collected through extensive online research and interviews with a number of cultural workers in Morocco's independent cultural scene, as well as through conversations with professionals working in international cooperation with experience in the country. It draws on previous Mobility Funding Guides for the Arab region (2020) and the African continent (2019) published by On the Move. The institutions/funders listed in those guides were contacted in order to update the information for applicants.

In the post-pandemic context, there is an increased desire in Morocco to develop international cultural exchanges. Some continental mobility funds, such as Africa Art Lines in Morocco, have put their activities on hold, but there remain opportunities for residencies, training, exchange, and other activities from regional programmes such as Arab Fund for Arts and Culture, Al Mawred Al Thaqafy, Mophradat, or The Arab Council for Social Sciences.

While mobility opportunities generally come from these private and non-governmental institutions, or from international (especially European) cooperation, the public sector in Morocco does also support the mobility of fine and visual artists and publishers to participate in cultural events abroad.

Introduction

This section presents information on existing international mobility opportunities for artists and culture professionals who are from Ceuta and Melilla or who aim to work in these regions of Spain. It is important to note that, given the specific focus of this guide on the Southern Mediterranean, other opportunities which have a broader geographical scope (e.g. mobility funding opportunities available at national level across Spain) have not been included. Similarly, because the focus lies on international, cross-border opportunities, schemes meant to enable collaboration between Ceuta and Melilla and other regions in Spain have not been included either.

The evidence obtained shows that there is a very limited range of opportunities responding to the criteria established. In particular, only one scheme, meant to enable students from Ceuta to conduct artistic university studies elsewhere in Spain or abroad, has been identified. In addition to the selection criteria outlined above, another factor in the limited number of opportunities may be the relatively small scale of the territories covered (Ceuta and Melilla have an official population of approximately 170,000 inhabitants altogether). Furthermore, the research relies on information available online. Other opportunities may exist but could either not be accessible online or have not been identified during this research exercise.

In addition to the listed programmes, the guide includes other information resources which are regularly updated and which could complement the references collected here. Readers should also remember to consult the chapter on International Mobility Funding for the South Mediterranean Region, as this will contain additional programmes covering the relevant regions of Spain.

Introduction

The information in this section was collected through extensive online research and interviews with a number of cultural workers in Tunisia's independent cultural scene, as well as through conversations with professionals working in international cooperation with experience in the country. It draws on previous Mobility Funding Guides for the Arab region (2020) and the African continent (2019) published by On the Move. The institutions/funders listed in those guides were contacted in order to update the information for applicants.

Since joining the Creative Europe programme in 2014, the Tunisian cultural scene has seen a significant increase in the mobility of its artists internationally, and has hosted a considerable number of international cultural projects and collaborations on Tunisian soil.

In this guide, we were unfortunately unable to find data or calls about projects for cultural mobility from the Tunisian public sector (from the Ministry of Cultural Affairs, Carthage International Theatre Days Festival, or the National Establishment for the Promotion of Cultural and Artistic Festivals and Events, for instance). Instead, the mobility opportunities in this guide mainly come from local private institutions (Kamel Lazaar Foundation and L'Art Rue), regional organisations (Arab Fund for Arts and Culture, Al Marwred Al Thaqafy, etc.), and international NGOs and foreign cultural institutes. These organisations finance incoming or outgoing mobility within the framework of cultural exchanges (festivals, residencies, training, workshops, etc.) with the aim of developing networks and strengthening links between countries.

This report is by no means exhaustive but allows artists, cultural workers and researchers to find their own route to international mobility. Readers should also remember to consult the chapter on International Mobility Funding for the South Mediterranean Region, as this will contain additional programmes covering Tunisia.
